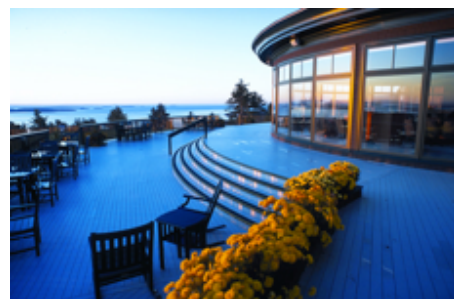


Science teachers:

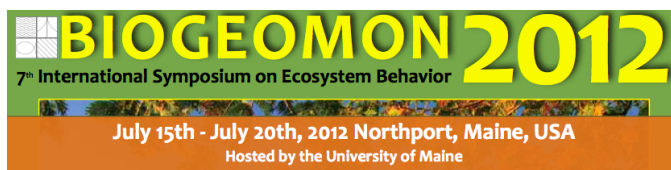
Dates: Attend at least one day of the conference, July 16-19
